SVP DECEMBER 2023 ELECTION RESULTS

Skagit Valley Pickleball (SVP) is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization run by volunteers interested in the growth of pickleball in Skagit County and surrounding areas. The Club's By-Laws call for turnover of Board positions on a staggered, annual basis. Last December, we held a membership election in order to fill several open positions.

Unfortunately, we were unable to fill the critical Vice President position, so we are asking interested members to volunteer for this and other open positions in the Club. Please click <u>HERE</u> (or see page 5) to learn about currently open Board Positions.

 Anna Wright and Dan Budzynski became the new "Members at Large" as of January 1, 2024. Pam Barnes retained her seat as Treasurer.

The following initiatives were also passed:

- Reduced the Minimum Membership age to 16 years of age (approved by 76%).
- Changed the voting threshold at the Annual General Meeting to 50% + 1 of those in attendance (approved by 87%).
- Changed our business model going from a 100% volunteer organization to contracting some of our members' services (approved by 88%).

We would like to thank everyone who took the time to vote in our first-ever online election. The election, which closed on December 15, 2023, had over 370 votes cast. We used the website ElectionRunner.com to capture the votes by secret ballot.

VOLUNTEER BOARD MEMBERS NEEDED

We have had some changes in the SVP Board and are calling for volunteers to fill the following key positions. If you are interested in filling any of these roles, or would like more information, click **HERE**.

President – this is a two-year commitment. The first year is spent as President. The second year will be spent as Past President. This is a voting position. Responsibilities:

- Presides over all meetings.
- Sets SVP goals and objectives with Board approval.
- Enforces/approves SVP policies and procedures.
- Appoints committee Chairmen with consultation and approval of two-thirds of the Board.
- Approves all SVP expenditures over \$200 as written by the Treasurer.
- Coordinates/interfaces with local governmental units and other clubs as needed.
- Performs other functions as may be necessary for the efficient and effective operation of SVP activities.

Vice President – this is a three-year commitment. The first year is spent as VP, the second year as President, and the third year as Past President. This is a voting position.

Responsibilities:

- Oversees Treasurer, Secretary, and SVP committees.
- Provides effective guidance to committees as needed.
- Ensures SVP assets and properties (real and virtual) are properly safeguarded.
- Ensures SVP records are maintained and effectively protected.
- Handles the disciplinary process if needed for SVP members.
- Assists and develops SVP playing policies as may be needed for training and regular play.
- Ensures SVP is in compliance with all applicable rules, policies, and other requirements when SVP uses public parks and other established playing areas.
- Ensures all necessary resources are available for SVP member play as may be needed.

Social Committee Chair – this is a two-year commitment, appointed by the Board. This is not a voting position.

Responsibilities:

- Provides opportunities for club members to socialize in recreational and/or competitive activities. Helps organize volunteers for events and functions of the club.
- Assists in planning the annual meeting for logistics, hospitality, food.
- Plans events that promote the club in the community. Example: festivals and parades, etc.

Recreational Play Committee Chair —Two-year commitment, appointed by Board. This is not a voting position.

- Plan and conduct recreational play opportunities for members including leagues, round robins, partner challenges and other structured play.
- Plan and conduct skill development opportunities for members including lessons, clinics, and training for future trainers.
- Works with President to identify play scheduling (open play, member play, etc.) systems if permissible at various venues.

Communications Committee: Two-year commitment, appointed by the Board.

- Maintains club website design and content, including both the front- and back-end configurations.
- Establishes and maintains club social media accounts such as Facebook and Instagram.
- Provides technology support to Board officers and committees as needed.
- Works with treasurer regarding payments made via website and other technological means (PayPal, Square, Wix, Stripe, etc).
- Works with Membership as they process new and existing members through website tools and databases.
- Responsible for club logos and look and feel of club communications and signage. Holds master logo images for print and online usage, and interfaces with other committees on their usage.
- Responsible for coordination of newsletter content and publication.
